### **3. The Time and Materials Needed to Complete the Lessons**

In order to complete the lessons you will need this workbook, a pen or pencil and a box of crayons. The workbook can be completed in a minimum of 12 weeks. Although the lessons can be studied at random, there is a definite advantage in following the order given in the workbook.

### **4. Suggested Plans of Study**

This workbook can be completed as a self-directed study or as part of a group study:

Plan 1—Group study: If you study in a group, it will take about a week to complete each lesson. The group does this by taking about one hour to complete all five questions. Use the rest of the week to finish the last two pages of summarizing and learning to apply the lesson.

Plan 2—Self-directed study: This self-directed study will also take a week to complete each lesson. You do this by answering one or more of the five questions per day and then doing the next two pages to finish the week. It is always when studying by yourself to have someone monitor your progress or answer questions on a regular basis.

### **5. The Format of the Lessons**

Each lesson is divided into seven parts which are introduced by the following symbols:

## 1. From Genesis to Revelation

Many people when reading the Bible have difficulty putting the various parts together into a united whole. This is no wonder, when we consider that the 66 books of the Bible were written in both prose and poetry, over a 1500 year period, by some 40 authors in a wide range of styles and settings. Yet God, as the Divine Inspirer of Scripture, was able to bring out the one theme that met man's greatest need—to be restored to a lost relationship with his Maker. In this introductory lesson we are going to study this grand, overarching theme of the Bible.

### 1. How Did the World Begin?

**Genesis 1:1,31; 2:1-2** In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. . . . 31 God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. And there was evening, and there was morning—the sixth day. 2:1 Thus the heavens and the earth were completed. . . . 2 By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work.

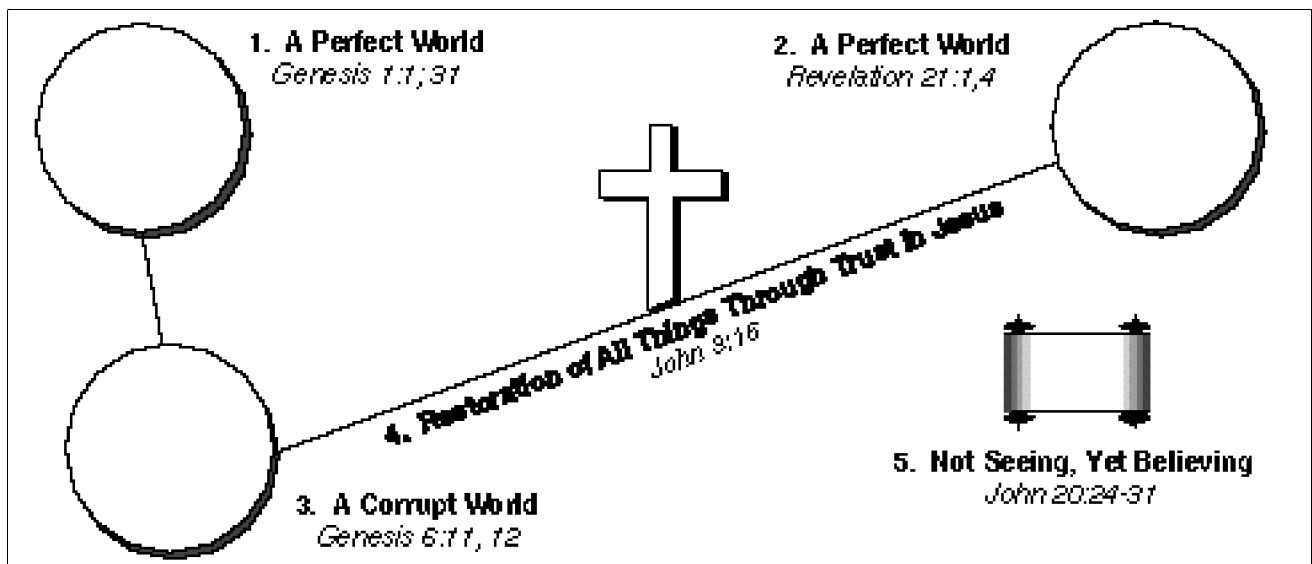

## 5. How Can We Trust Someone We Have Never Seen?

 John 20:24-31 Now Thomas . . . one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe it."

26 A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe."

28 Thomas said to him, "My Lord and my God!" 29 Then Jesus told him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." 30 Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. 31 But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

# How to Study the Bible

In this lesson we've learned that our once perfect world was corrupted by man through his disobedience. In His infinite love and mercy God sent His Son to restore all things to their original perfection and happiness. By reading the Bible we can develop the dynamic faith that is necessary to cooperate with Jesus in His work of restoration.

## How Often Should I Study?

Learning about the Bible once a week in church is not enough to nourish our Christian life. In the Lord's Prayer, Jesus taught us to ask, "Give us this day our daily bread." Ask God to help you read a portion of scripture every day. Choose a time during each day when you can give full attention to learn more about Jesus.

## What Should I Study?

1. *The Book of John*—This gospel has simple stories that are easy to relate to.
2. *The Book of Proverbs*—There are 31 chapters in this book of wisdom. Study the chapter that corresponds to the same date of the month. Example: On June 21st read Proverbs 21 etc.
3. *A Daily Devotional Book*— These books give a Scripture and reading for each day.
4. *These Lessons*—You can also look up the texts of these lessons in your own Bible.

## How Should I Study?

1. *Begin with Prayer*—Before you begin to study, ask God to give you wisdom and insight.
2. *Quality not Quantity*—A careful reading of Scripture will be more helpful than a hasty glance.
3. *Journalizing*—Many people keep a record of their daily encounters with God in the Bible.
