

Lamb/Will/Beast The Biblical Model

Steps to Christ, 46: "Everything depends on the right action of the will. The power of choice God has given to men; it is theirs to exercise. You cannot change your heart, you cannot of yourself give to God its affections; but you can choose to serve Him. You can give Him your will; He will then work in you to will and to do according to His good pleasure."

Steps to Christ, 46: "The warfare against self is the greatest battle that was ever fought. The yielding of self, surrendering all to the will of God, requires a struggle; but the soul must submit to God before it can be renewed in holiness."

Using our own Effort Observation

Steps to Christ, 44: There are those who profess to serve God, while they rely upon their own efforts to obey His law, to form a right character, and secure salvation. Their hearts are not moved by any deep sense of the love of Christ, but they seek to perform the duties of the Christian life as that which God requires of them in order to gain heaven. Such religion is worth nothing.



The Beast uses Force Observation

Revelation 13:16-17: He also forced everyone, small and great, rich and poor, free and slave, to receive a mark on his right hand or on his forehead, 17 so that no one could buy or sell unless he had the mark, which is the name of the beast or the number of his name.



The Beast uses Force

Observation

The Kress Collection, 148: God will punish those who attempt to compel their fellow men to keep the first day of the week. They tempt them to deny their allegiance to God. They accept the fruit of the forbidden tree, and try to force others to eat it. They will try to compel their fellowmen to work on the seventh day of the week and rest on the first.




God does not Force Observation

Steps to Christ, 44: The government of God is not, as Satan would make it appear, founded upon a blind submission, an unreasoning control. It appeals to the intellect and the conscience. "Come now, and let us reason together" is the Creator's invitation to the beings He has made. Isaiah 1:18. God does not force the will of His creatures. He cannot accept an homage that is not willingly and intelligently given.



God does not Force Observation

Desire of Ages, 466: In the work of redemption there is no compulsion. No external force is employed. Under the influence of the Spirit of God, man is left free to choose whom he will serve. In the change that takes place when the soul surrenders to Christ, there is the highest sense of freedom.





Uniqueness of Christ Introduction

Many of us would agree with Clark Pinnock when he says, "By all accounts the meaning of Christ's lordship in a religiously plural world is one of the hottest topics on the agenda of theology in the nineties."

Gives a brief historical overview of the increasing attention to the topic.



Uniqueness of Christ The Three Models

Pluralist—A Creation Paradigm

Begins with the commonality of creation Concerned about human relationship Predominantly horizontalist
Weak theology of fall and sin
No faith in Christ or conversion
Mission is unnecessary, disrespectful



Uniqueness of Christ The Three Models

Inclusivist—Paradigm of Universal Soteriology

Begins with unique Christ event

Weak in personal relationship

Prior choice of salvation for all

Strong vertical but weak horizontal

Little faith in Christ or conversion

Mission: You are already saved



Uniqueness of Christ The Three Models

Exclusivist—An Ecclesiocentric Paradigm

Begins with Church as ark of salvation
Relationship with Christ in Church
Prior choice: salvation only in my Church
Very optimistic about the Church
Strong faith in Christ and conversion
Highly missional in people joining Church

Uniqueness of Christ Two Presuppositions

Relation of Faith and Culture

* Faith is distinct from culture

Acts: Faith takes many shapes

"As the evangelical community has become more culture affirming, the distinction between faith and culture has become harder to maintain, and its impact on our missiology more pervasive."



Uniqueness of Christ Jesus Christ is Lord

Three Elements of New Paradigm

JESUS Christ is Lord: Faith Particularist
Lord above all cultures and churches.

Jesus CHRIST is Lord: Culturally Pluralist
Christ is the creator, Lord of all

Jesus Christ is LORD: Ecclesiologically
Inclusivist
Jesus is Lord of the church and mission
